Handicap System Changes for 2020

The R&A and USGA have worked together to develop a single World Handicap System (W.H.S.)

It is based on the current Handicap System used in Australia and which Partakers follow.

This will take effect from **<u>30Th January 2020.</u>**

So our **Palm Meadows** game will be under the old system and from **The Glades** onwards under the new system.

The changes to our system are:

• There will be a maximum **G.A. Handicap** under W.H.S. of 54.

This will mean we will change our Maximum Daily Handicap from 40 up to 55.

We currently have 3 members that this will affect.

However it will be course dependent which means we will play under their maximum handicaps.

• There will be a Bonus reduction 1.0 shot from G.A. Handicap when a player's "Played to" is **7 to 10** shots better than their G.A. Handicap on that day.

Bernie Bowen's Palm Meadows round is a perfect example. His starting G.A. was **31.9** but his "Played to" was **23.9** with a difference of 8.0. Lucky we only start this system at The Glades.

There will also be a Bonus reduction 2.0 shot from G.A. Handicap when a player's **"Played to" is more than 10** shots better than their G.A. Handicap on that day.

- The 0.93 Multiplier will be transferred out of the **G.A. Handicap Calculation** and into the **Daily Handicap Calculation** which will be reflected in the **Look-Up Charts** for each individual Golf Course.
- Adjustment made to Daily Handicap if Scratch Rating is different to Par.

If Scratch Rating 73 & Par 70; 3 is added to the Daily Handicap calculation (i.e. 73 - 70 = +3)

If Scratch Rating 68 & Par 70; 2 is subtracted from the Daily Handicap calculation (i.e. 68 - 70 = -2)

The actual result is that each **G.A. Handicap** was increased by 6% to 7% on average.

However most of the **Daily Handicaps** will be reduced by a shot or two, depending on **Scratch Rating V Par** for each course.

• As a consequence of changes our determination of members Grades will change.

A Grade	G.A. Handicap	0 to 21.0	(was 0 to 19.5)
B Grade	G.A. Handicap	21.1 to 27.8	(was 19.6 to 25.9)
C Grade	G.A. Handicap	27.9 to 54	(was 26.0 to 40)
